2025 Patient Fellows Program

The ALS/MND Patient Fellows Program empowers people living with ALS/MND and their Caregivers to actively participate in global scientific conversations. By bridging the gap between the community and researchers, the program fosters progress towards effective treatments and ultimately a cure for ALS/MND. Who can apply:

- People diagnosed with ALS/MND
- Caregivers of people living with ALS/MND
- ALS/MND gene carriers without a diagnosis

In 2025, two types of Patient Fellowships will be offered:

In-Person Fellowship (10 available) – includes:

- Registration for the MND Association's International Symposium on ALS/MND, taking place December 5–7, 2025, in San Diego, USA
- Up to 4 nights of hotel accommodation (Dec. 5–8), including breakfast, at a hotel near the Symposium venue
- A travel stipend of up to £1600, reimbursed after the event
- Opportunities to connect with other Patient Fellows and support from a dedicated Patient Fellows Coordinator
- Note: In-person Fellows are responsible for their own caregiving arrangements, travel to and from San Diego, meals (except hotel breakfasts and Symposium-provided lunches), and any additional hotel nights beyond those provided.
- Optional virtual registration for the International Alliance's Annual Meeting on November 29–30 and Allied Professionals Meeting (including ALS/MND Connect) on December 1–2

Online Fellowship (12 available) – includes:

- Virtual registration for the International Symposium on ALS/MND Access to selected live-streamed sessions, the ePoster hall, and on-demand content after the event
- Optional virtual registration for the International Alliance's Annual Meeting on November 29–30 and Allied Professionals Meeting (including ALS/MND Connect) on December 1–2
